

INSTRUCTIONS FOR BFC240 LACE BOWL AND DOILY –Roses

If you have purchased the complete set you will have all the designs listed above. From these you can make 6 bowls. (3 sizes, 5 or 6 sides) and three doilies. If you purchase just the small, medium or large, you will be able to make a 5 or 6 sided bowl and a doily. Each of these bowls and doilies can be done in one or two colors. Plus there is a design to make a matching aster in each size.

Before starting your bowl and doily, make sure you check the design numbers and choose the correct ones for the bowl and doily you want to make.

Stitch all designs on water soluble stabilizer. Do not rinse. I use two layers of Badgemaster and 40wt rayon thread. Any equivalents are fine. For the bowl I use the same thread in the bobbin as I do in the top thread. For the doily I used the first color in the bobbin for the entire design.

Bowl assembly: start with the bottom and one petal. Zig Zag stitch these together. Then add the next petal and continue stitching around the bottom until you have all 5 or 6 sides

attached. Then starting at the lower corner of one petal, stitch two petals together, bringing the sides together as you go until you reach the point where you want the petals to join, turn your work and stitch back until you reach the bottom section. Repeat for each petal.

Rinse your bowl. Set aside to dry, shaping the petals as you desire. They can be left straight up, curved outward or inward. Check periodically during drying and re-shape as necessary. If after drying you find any stray threads on the edges clip them. It is not unusual to have a few with this type of design and will not hurt the overall bowl.

Doily Assembly: Makes eight petals. Stitch each Doily section to the center with a zig zag stitch. Stitch the sides as above for the bowl.

When Bowl and Doily are completely dry, iron them quickly with some steam to give a nice smooth finish.
